In the past 15 months, your Board has worked diligently to put the League on a firm footing.

Major accomplishments include:

- a. **Growth**
 - i. 8 new teams
 - ii. 60 new members
 - iii. 43 weeks of play per year
- b. **Financial Stability**
 - i. Revenue: Fall 24 was \$4k - Fall 26 budgeted at \$24k.

- i. Fall 2024 - 1 Board member, Spring 2025 - 5 Board members + 1 at large

d. Legal Status

- i. Expect SDPL to be in good standing with the State of CA and IRS by the end of the season.
- ii. Once in good standing, we will conduct normal banking, update all financial reports and conduct an audit.

2. **Spring2026 Accomplishments:** [Presented by Curtis Moore, President](#)

Below are the Boards Spring 2026 Priorities (as presented at the last Captains Meeting) and the progress we have made.

- a. **Implement approved spring 2025 proposals.**
- b. **New Player Program and continued growth.** Add 2 new teams and 25 new players.
- c. **Build upon skills training programs.** Develop program structure, ID potential training materials, seek program manager.
- d. **West Coast Challenge 85 in Palm Springs.** Created WCC entity/bylaws, etc., added Palm Springs League, Tournament livestreaming on YouTube, B & C division participation.
- e. **Software for league and tournaments.** SDPL joined BCA Pool League and converted to LMS and automated scorekeeping. WCC buying Digital Pool licenses for our spring tournaments.
- f. **Resolve legal issues.** We filed necessary paperwork and are 6-8 weeks from good standing with the State of CA and the IRS.
- g. **Captain & Player communication:** We put in place tools for you AND your players to stay informed of what's happening, rules, play schedules, team and individual standings, and more. But many still do not know or use these tools. **To make your job as captain easier YOU** need to inform and encourage them to use them.
 - a. SDPool.org for Weekly **Table Talk**, team and individual stats and match play schedules. The website also has SDPL Bylaws and Matchplay Rules.
 - b. Fargorate App for viewing team and individual stats, match play schedules for next four weeks, and more. Instructions for downloading & using is on SDPool.org

What problems does the Board wish to address at this meeting?

- a. **Unfilled Board Member positions** - We need help folks!
 - i. Secretary (Voting member)
 - ii. New Player Program Manager (At-large role)
 - iii. Skills Training Program Manager (At-large role)
- b. **Player Conduct:** Unpleasant arguments and loud disputes between players and teams drives away members and potential recruits. **Response: Shut The Fuck Up Rule.**
 - i. **Shut the Fuck Up Rule guidance** was published in the 4/6/26 table talk. It was intended to garner attention and clarification to rule 1.6 PLAYING WITHOUT REFEREES.

Rule 1.6 PLAYING WITHOUT REFEREES

(PLAY-OFFS ONLY) - When a referee is not available, the Tournament Director or designated event official will fulfill the duties of the referee.

(DURING REGULAR SEASON PLAY) - When a referee is not available, the players can designate a table watcher. Any team member may assume the duties of the table watcher to observe any questionable play on the table. Only the designated table watcher or the player may call fouls.

- 1. Regardless of past practice, Board interpretation & clarification of that rule is:
 - a. During match play, each game is a contest between the two players. Players must watch and know the rules.
 - b. Both players may request an observer for a close shot & observer determination is final.
 - c. There is NOT a dedicated watcher for every shot.
 - d. Captains are called to assist with a rules/shot dispute to calmly & amicably resolve. So, captains should watch but not call the foul. Captains are not de facto referees. Any teammate who interrupts the flow of the game is guilty of unsportsmanlike conduct and precludes the player from taking that action, whether to call a foul or take a shot.
 - e. If you wish to change this, propose it at a Rules Committee meeting.
- ii. The objective of this rule interpretation is to encourage teams to control the actions of their own players and minimize disputes.
- iii. We encourage collegial banter between players and teams. Problems generally arise as a result of tone, belligerence and an "I KNOW I AM RIGHT" attitude.
Please talk to and manage your players.

Based on the STFU discussion, the Board is to revisit guidance and assess role of captain in calling a foul in May 20th Board meeting. Updated guidance will be provided via Table Talk.

- c. **Forfeits and rescheduling** causes several problems:
 - i. Players/ teams must pay table fees for forfeits.
 - ii. While teams receive forfeit wins, players do not.
 - iii. Player show up expecting to play 4 games
 - iv. Finding another time when the 8 players can reschedule is **very** difficult.
 - v. **Recommended New Rule: Double posting: See Rules Changes**

- d. **Minimize the weeks for playoffs and find a fair way to select WCC B and C division observer teams.**
 - i. Board has committed to schedule 40+ weeks per year for regular season play
 - ii. Playoffs are this year limited to 3 weeks but ideally should be 2 weeks. APA, our primary “competitor,” operates with 2 weeks between seasons and all other playoffs on the weekend.
 - iii. The Board has approved sending the top teams from the B and C divisions to WCC as observers, referees and staff under the same provisions for the top playoff team.

Proposal: This season, give the Board an exception to the Traditional Playoff rules that allows us to test a Divisional Team Playoff format.

- e. **Training Program:** With the large influx of new players, many have **no prior league experience.** They are unfamiliar with league rules, strategies and key skills.

Proposal: SDPL will create a skill training program that will recommend a video library using well established, proven materials, coupled with periodic in-person training by experienced players. Finally, we will include short vid clips - “Table Tips” in the weekly

Table Talk showing players how to solve common problems such as banks, rail shots, etc.
This requires someone to be the Skills Training Manager At-large Board Member as the current Board does not have time.

- f. **Convert SDPL to a 501c(3) charity league** to distinguish SDPL from other APA and BCA leagues, improve the league's public image and give the Board a potential tool to avoid/postpone green fees for Monday nights.

The Board reviewed proposed rule changes from Rules Committee meetings and voted to move the following rule changes forward for Captains approval.

- Rule change explanation in blue
- Proposed change in *red italics*

- I. **New Match Play rule after Number of Players Required - Allow double posting during regular match play** to help lower the number of forfeits, postponed matches, and need for more than 7 players. Opposing team captain picks the player to play in two positions for up to 8 games. **Provisionally effective Fall 2026** with Fall season captains to ratify by email vote prior to start of spring 2027.

New Rule

1.8.1 DOUBLE POSTING – *Teams with fewer than four players may have one player fill 2 player positions ("double post") playing up to 8 games under these conditions:*

- 1. Acting team captain must notify opposing captain of need to double-post before start of match.*
- 2. Opposing team captain chooses the player to double post and play up to eight games total. Un-played games are forfeit.*
- 3. A team may only double post once per match. (Cannot double post two players.)*
- 4. If both teams need to double post, the visiting team picks first.*
- 5. If a chosen player cannot or refuses to play the extra games, those games are forfeited.*
- 6. Late arrivals may not replace a double-posted player.*
- 7. Double posting is not allowed for players leaving early; those games are forfeited if no fifth player is available.*
- 8. A team with two players to start may: 1) double post one player and 2) forfeit four games. Or, 1) double post one player in 3rd position at start of match and 2) initiate play for player in 4th position upon arrival.*
- 9. Double posting is not permitted during last 4 weeks of play nor during the playoffs.*
- 10. Double posting is not permitted during a previously postponed "make-up" match.*
- 11. Provisionally effective Fall 2026 with Fall season captains to ratify by email vote prior to start of spring 2027.*

- II. **1.4 CUE STICK REQUIREMENTS:** Modify this SDPL match play rule to align with BCAPL requirements. This would further define a legal stick and cue ball. (Red Circle, Red Measles, Black Diamond cue balls OK.) **Effective immediately.**

1.4 CUE STICK REQUIREMENTS

1. Your cue sticks must meet BCA Equipment Specifications excerpted below.

BCA POOL CUE SPECIFICATIONS:

Width of tip: No minimum/14 mm maximum

Weight: No minimum/25 oz. maximum

The cue tip may not be of a material that can scratch or damage the addressed ball. The cue tip on any stick must be composed of a piece of specially processed leather or other fibrous or pliable material that extends the natural line of the shaft end of the cue and contacts the cue ball when the shot is executed. The ferrule, if of a metal material, may not be more than 1 inch in length.

2. If you use an illegal cue stick it is a foul, and the illegal cue stick must be removed from play. An unsportsmanlike conduct warning must be issued; a second violation results in loss of game; a third violation results in loss of match.

1.4 CUE STICK *and BALL* REQUIREMENTS

1. Your cue sticks must meet BCAPL Equipment Specifications.

BCAPL POOL CUE SPECIFICATIONS:

Width of tip: No minimum/14 mm maximum

Weight: No minimum/25 oz. maximum

Length: 40" minimum / No maximum

The cue tip may not be of a material that can scratch or damage the addressed ball. The cue tip on any stick must be composed of a piece of specially processed leather or other fibrous or pliable material that extends the natural line of the shaft end of the cue and contacts the cue ball when the shot is executed. The ferrule, if of a metal material, may not be more than 1 inch in length.

2. If you use an illegal cue stick it is a foul, and the illegal cue stick must be removed from play. An unsportsmanlike conduct warning must be issued; a second violation results in loss of game; a third violation results in loss of match.

All balls will have a diameter of 2¼" ± .005". The weight of the balls will be between 5½ and 6 ounces, but all object balls used in any match must be of equal weight. Slight variations in the weight of the cue ball with respect to the object balls may occur depending on the type of cue ball.

- III. **8.0 TOURNAMENTS:** Modify this bylaw to define seeding of the Open Individuals, Women's and Rising Star tournaments. **Effective immediately.**

- IV. **Allow acting team captain to call coaching.** This change would allow the "team captain" to call coaching and any one person give the coaching. Provides a better learning experience yet deviates from WCC rules. BCAPL allows leagues to modify coaching rules.

call the time out. When acting Captain is shooting any player on team may call time out. Player may refuse the time out and retain it for later in the game. Any one-person present may give the coaching.

1.15 COACHING VIOLATION - The shooter can ask which group of balls is theirs at any time, and the opponent must answer accurately.
